LIFEBOAT DEMAND RIGID

Deaft Offered Instead of La Follette Document Substantially Adopts Requirements Set at London Conference.

WASHINGTON, June 19 .- A substitute for the La Follette seamen's bill passed by the Senate was favorably reported to the House today by Chairman Alexander, of the merchant marine committee, following months of con-

The Alexander bill substantially adopts the requirements agreed on by the convention on safety of life at sea the convention on safety of life at sea at London, last January, as to lifeboats on ocean vessels, and applies these in modified form to United States vessels in ocean veyages on routes not more than 20 nautical miles off shore and on the great lakes. It would require an ocean passenger steamer, at every moment of its voyage, to have aboard no more persons than there are accommodations in lifeboats and life rafts, at least 75 per cent of this equipment to be lifeboats.

On great lakes passenger steamers running not more than three miles off the shore, the bill would provide that lifeboat and pontoon life-raft equipment must equal the number of persons aboard, 75 per cent to be in lifeboats. Between May 15 and September 15 these steamers might lessen the lifeboat and life-raft equipment to 56 per cent of the persons aboard, lifeboats to

these steamers might lessen the lifeboat and life-raft equipment to 50 per cent of the persons aboard, lifeboats to constitute two-fifths of the equipment. American passenger steamers whose keels are laid after July 1, 1915, for ocean service and on the great lakes more than three miles off shore, would be compelled to carry lifeboats and liferafts for all aboard, with 75 per cent in lifeboats. Cargo steamers would carry enough lifeboats for all aboard under existing regulations.

The Senate bill requires two able seamen for each lifeboat. The House, however, lessens this requirement by

however, lessens this requirement by providing that an officer, petty officer, or able seaman may be placed in charge of each lifebeat or pontoon raft to which shall be assigned any three members of the crew who hold certifi cates of efficiency.
