ington, June 31.—Complete returns from the Pennsylvanta Senatorial primary show that Gifford Pinchot, the third party candidate for Senator, received only 7 per cent of the total vote cast; enator Penrose received 40 per cent the total, and A. Mitchell Palmer, the Democratic nominee, 21 per cent, and the remainder of the vote went to the defeated Republican and Demo-

cratic candidates.

The detailed figures show the total vote cast in the Pennsylvania Senatorial primary to have been as fol-
