"The board of censors has known for a long time that we run our feature films off at the office every Thursday afternoon, but none of the members of the board came to see the run of "The Thumb Print." No objection was offered in advance to our running it and the only statement I got from the Mayor's secretary, when I saw him this morning, was that we had run from the Mayor's secretary, when I saw him this morning, was that we had run it without the censors having viewed it. He declined to discuss the matter with the manager of the film company. "The Thumb Print' is a detective story, similar to hundreds of other detective films run in Portland with the sanction of the censors.
