Some of these, he said, would come to trial. Others, he said, had learned that they were under investigation and had left town. He cited one woman, who, he said, was conducting a disorderly house and who had left. The particu-lar cases against the Elks' cafe were for alleged misdemeanors of the early morning of July 3 and June 7. Valiane, a professional "informer,"
