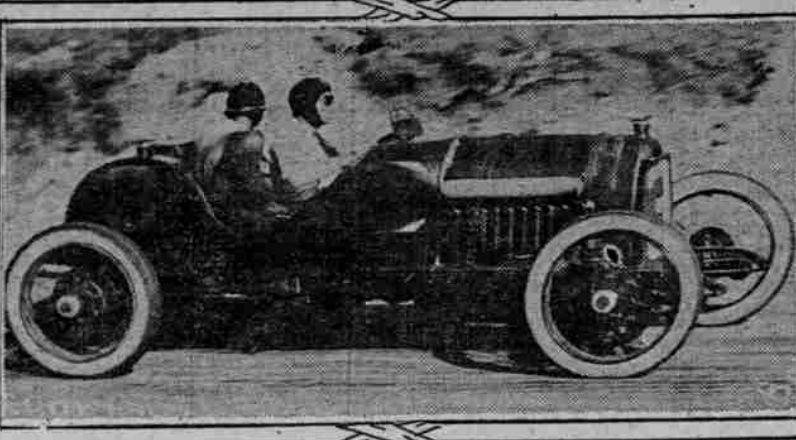
SHAKEUP DUE IN REDS LINEUP President August Herrmann Announces Acquisition.

JEVNE PLAYS HERE TONIGHT

Former Three-Cushion Title-Holder Is at the City.

For seven consecutive years, from 1909 to 1907, Lloyd Jevne won the three-cushion billiard title of the world, and as a result he now holds the handsome gold medal put up by the Brunswick-Balke-Collerander Company.
