Economy Keynote of Consolidation Scheme for Town and County Work.

#### PORTLAND FIRST HELPED

Proposed Measure Would Give People Right to Vote on Issue, but, as State Grows, Many Others in End Would Be Benefited.

SALEM, Or., July 9.—(Special.)— Economy is the keynote of an argu-ment filed with Secretary of State Ol-cott today for publication in the election pamphlet in favor of a constitu-tional amendment providing for an election for voting upon a plan for the consolidation of counties containing cities of more than 100,000 inhabitants with the cities, which was referred by the last Legislative Assembly. The argument was prepared by a

legislative committee composed of Rob-ert S. Farrell, State Senator, Multnomah County; Jay H. Upton, Representative, Multnomah County, and C. J. Forsgtrom, Representative, Union It says:

Portland First Benefited. "This proposed amendment to the constitution is submitted to the voters of Oregon by the Legislative Assembly. If adopted, it will only affect Portland and Multnomah County at the present time, but as the day will soon commany other cities in the state can take advantage of its benefits, it is of vital importance to each voter in the

"The adoption of the amendment will not in itself consolidate the city and county governments. It merely gives the people living in a city of 100,000 population the right to vote either for or against the plan to consolidate their city and county under one government, thereby saving the taxpayers the up-keep of one complete set of officials.

City Pays All of Taxes. When one city occupies practically when one city occasions with all the territory of a county, and the same people, the same property and the same benefits pay all the taxes to two separate and distinct governments which exercise in effect the same powers, it takes very little argument to convince any voter that there is no necessity for this fifth wheel to the

"By abolishing one complete set of these officials and adding a few deputies to the other set, the business of the city and county can be handled with less cost, less confusion, less elections and more conveniences to all the voters.
