 DEATH TO MOTORCYCLIST COMES AT MILE A MINUTE. ST. LOUIS, July 17 .- Thomas B. Lewis, of Birmingham, Ala., was fatally injured today in the races being run under the auspices of the

Federation of American Motorcyclists, now in convention here. He crashed into the fence and fell over a 28-foot embankment during the first race of the day. The accident occurred while rounding a curve. Lewis' machine elimbed to the top of the dirt track and collided with the fence. He was picked up un-conscious. Lewis was rushed to the St. Luke's Hospital, where he died shortly after being placed upon the operating table. Officials at the racetrack said Lewis was making a
