ZAPATA BECOMING MENACE TO CAPITAL

Washing Apprehensive Over Outcome, Knowing Strength of the Southern Forces.

NEW PARLEYS ARE BEGUN

Carranza Embassies in Communication With Zapata With View to Bringing Military Operations Under One Head.

PUERTO MEXICO, July 19.—According to the latest reports, ex-president Huerta and his party expect to leave here Tuesday. Generalis Huerta and his party expect to leave here Tuesday.

Dispatches from Mexico City and Vera Cruz, which said the followers of Zapata were dangerously near the capital, are being received by the state department. Officials here for some time have been cognizant of the strength of the Zapata troops, but the United States Government has been unable to exert its influence with Zapata to prevent an attack on Mexico City.

Embassies from General Carranza are now in communication with Zapata, and it is hoped through these parleys to bring the military operations of the revolution under one head.

Rebel forces were hastened southward to help maintain order at the capital. The efforts of the American Government are directed toward influencing a quick settlement between Carranza and Carbajal so that a stable government may be set up without loss of time.

The constitutionalist agency here has delivered to the mediators a note rejecting the invitation for representatives of General Carranza and General Huerta to meet in peace conferences. It was written by Carranza before Huerta resigned, but delivery was delayed.

CAPITAL IS WELL PROTECTED

Governor Iturbide Inspires Confidence by Prompt Measures.

MEXICO CITY, July 19.—The gap in the railway between Vera Cruz and Mexico City is to be closed, and by Tuesday, it is expected, direct communication will be re-established. The president of the railway, General Carbajal, today informed the British minister he had issued orders for the immediate completion of the work.
