FIRE WORLD COMES FROM MAN IN WILDS

Joe Knowles Says Forest Full of Miners and Declares Early Work Is "Hell."

CHARCOAL USED TO WRITE

Letter on Pieces of Dry-Rotted White Fir—Says He Slept Before Open Fire First Night 10 Miles From Indian Creek.

CAMP KNOWLES, Klamath National Forest, July 24, via Grants Pass, Or., July 26.—(Special.) Joe Knowles' first message from the wilderness was written with charcoal upon three flat pieces of dry-rotted white fir, in the following pages:

(1) "Sleep before open fire first night. Ten miles Indian Creek." (2) "Country full of miners." (3) "They are fishing or hunting all the time. If I can avoid the prospectors and get a living—"

(4) "I will do well. I have seen five prospectors and one has seen me." (5) "This is why hardest week. It is hell. You will hear from me Saturday."

Knowles' message was left during Thursday near the trail one-third of a mile down the valley from our cabin. On Friday we found the secret sign previously given us by Joe, and then, after a little search, a foot of a large cedar, 20 yards off the trail, the three pieces of wood.
