

FEDERALS PREPARE TO ABANDON CITY

Beleaguered Garrison, Without Water, Will Abandon City to Rebel Forces.

TRANSPORTS REACH BAY

Constitutionalists Will Then Hold Entire Pacific Coast of Mexico, Except Manzanillo, Which Is Being Pressed Hard.

NOGALES, Ariz., July 30.—Reports received here late today from Mazatlan said fighting was in progress there, with no advantage to either side as yet.

MAZATLAN, Mex., July 30.—The water supply of this beleaguered city is exhausted and evacuation will begin at any moment. Federal transports are lying in the harbor to receive the decamping garrison.

Under convoy of the gunboat Guerrero, the transports arrived here today. One, the Pesquera, received a field shell from the rebel forces.

In all probability evacuation would now be under way, had it not been that a heavy tropical squall swept the harbor today, driving ashore the steamship Bonita, which arrived here yesterday loaded with 600 federal troops, women and cattle from Lower California.

General Telles, commanding today sent 60 constitutionalist prisoners of war, as well as the captured crew of the sunken constitutionalist gunboat Tampico, to General Obregon at Colima.

Arrangements have been made to remove all foreigners still residing in Mazatlan to the foreign warships in the harbor, in case of disorders or danger from the constitutionalist fire during evacuation.

With the evacuation of this port, the constitutionalists will hold the entire Pacific coast of Mexico, except for Manzanillo, which is still held by the garrison that evacuated Guaymas.

SCHOLLS BRIDGE GIVES WAY

Washington County May Have to Settle for Accident.

SHERWOOD, Or., July 30.—(Special.)—An accident which, it is reported, will cost the county a settlement, occurred at the foot of Coley hill, two miles north of Sherwood, yesterday.

The engine belonged to Fred Langer, of Sherwood, and was badly damaged. The bridge, which is on a main travel road, has been neglected by the county, it is said, and at the time of the accident was in bad shape.

It was at this spot that a similar accident occurred about a year ago, which resulted in the killing of one man and the injury of two others.
