# KNOWLES BACK IN **CIVILIZATION AGAIN**

With Party, Nature-Man and Six Mules Greeted at Holland by Crowd.

### SCIENTIST IS SATISFIED

Not One Man in Million Could Have Repeated Ordeal of Thirty Days as Naked Man Did, Is Professor's Testimony.

BY ADDISON BENNETT GRANTS PASS, Or., Aug. 21 .- (Special.)-Joe Knowles and his party arrived at Holland at 2:15 this afternoon, saving made the trip from the camp, 19 miles to the south, since 6 o'clock this morning. The arriving party consisted of Knowles, Professor Edwards, two photographers and a guide, their motive power being six mules, all heavily packed. There was quite a crowd at Holland to meet them.

Knowles said the hardships of the 20 days had been trying, his greatest suffering being from his badly poisoned feet and the cold nights during the earlier stages. He had to turn night into day until he could get some sort of covering under which to sleep. Food did not bother him so much, he said, but the berries upon which he expect-ed to subsist for a few days had not yet ripened. However, he soon managed to get enough small fish to keep up his energy.

Color Like Copper Cent. As to his appearance upon his arrival, I only can say that he is about the color of a well-worn copper cent. His grayish beard showed that in the woods he had not found a stone sharp enough with which to shave.
