Merchant Marine Bill Amended.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4.—Amend-ments to the Administration merchant marine bill, agreed on at a White House to the requisite strength all command to the requisite strength all commands will be recruited up possibly to a war footing. The fact that the canal now is in active operation, and in view of possible complications because of the European war, it is considered vital that a force adequate to afford marine bill, agreed on at a White House conference several days ago, were adopted today by the House merchant marine committee. Ships bought by the Government company would be available as naval auxiliaries. Vessels at present in the Naxy and under the control of the Panama Raifroad Com-pany, which might be available for merchant trade, would be turned over to the new shipping company.



"While our country is absolutely neutral," said the Minister, "we have mobilized our army as a measure of precaution."


