On September 21 Russian troops took by storm the fortifications of Jaroslau, on the right bank of the River San.

By her conquests in Galicia, Russia now controls the great supply of gasoline in Europe.

The Russian movement is now described as a huge wedge, the right line of which extends roughly from Libau, on the Baltic, along the railroad line to Warsaw.

Russian troops occupying Senlawa, 18 miles north of Lublin, the Russian correspondent of the Reuters Telegram Company, found the town had been sacked by the Austrians.

An official report given out at Cetinje and telegraphed here by the correspondent of the Reuters Telegram Company, says the Montenegrins operating in Bosnia, after a hot engagement, took the little town of Niska, in the immediate neighborhood of Sarajevo, where the defeated Austrians have taken refuge after abandoning a large number of their arms.

In a dispatch from Rome, the correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company says a message from Cetinje brings the news that Montenegrins have captured Montak, a town which controls the only railroad in Southern Herzegovina.

The French fleet has been reported by the Petrograd correspondent to have been at Sandovaya, and the Austrians occupied the hills commanding several miles of open country and they swept the advancing Russians with guns and rifles.

In the Balkan war the Serbians have been taken after several days of hard fighting. The resistance of the Serbians there is broken and Serbian guns captured.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24.—Debate on the Administration war revenue bill was in full swing when the House adjourned this afternoon.

"The tariff is the fault of our business conditions and was 'suffering in a business way more than we ever have suffered since the war between the states'."

Senators Prepare to Act. Democrats of the Senate finance committee met tonight to get a flying start on the bill, which will be in their hands as soon as it comes from the House tomorrow.

BELGIUM DECLINES OFFER
