BELGIAN TRICKS GERMAN Papers Covering Manifesto Oiled at Night and Made Transparent.

ROME, via Paris, Oct. 2.—Reports from Berlin give particulars of the disclosures between General von der Goltz, the German governor of Belgium, and Burgomaster Max, of Brussels.

Von der Goltz ordered the burgomaster to remove the Belgian flags

from the public buildings, and Max published a manifesto, which explained to the population the necessity to comply before force.

FRENCH AUTO ORDER LARGE Touring Cars, Tractors and Trailers Will Be Bought in America.

SOUTH BETHLEHEM, Pa., Oct. 2.—Not only are motor trucks included in the large order of motor vehicles the government of France has requested the Bethlehem Steel Company to produce for use in the war, but touring

SEPTEMBER RAINS HEAVY Astoria Reports Show Excess for Month of 1.25 Inches.

ASTORIA, Or., Oct. 2.—(Special.)—According to the records in local Weather Observer Gilmore's office, September was an unusually wet month in this section. The precipitation was 4.84 inches, or 1.25 inches

excess of the corresponding month of previous years.

The greatest precipitation during any 24 hours was 37 inch on September 16. Rain fell on 16 days during the month, while there were eight clear, four partly cloudy and 18 cloudy days. The maximum temperature was 74 degrees on September 22 and 23 and the minimum was 48 degrees on September 6. The greatest daily range was 26 degrees.
