A Statement to the Public BY The Committee of One Hundred

The Committee of One Hundred is now engaged in checking up the lists of Portland signers of the "declaration of principles," appearing as a paid advertisement of the OREGON STATE BREWERS' ASSOCIATION in yesterday morning's Oregonian. We have found many persons who assert their names and those of their firms were signed without authority. Particularly is this the case of the Union Meat Company. There are a number of similar cases.

THE CHALLENGE. "The Committee of One Hundred consists of business and professional men and women from all over Oregon. We are making a fight on behalf of a dry Oregon. We have heard a great deal about what Oregon dry will do for Oregon. While we know business will be far better all over the state, as has been proved in every dry town in Oregon, the wet interests tell us business will be doomed unless we vote for the saloon. They tell us we won't be able to rent our property unless we have the saloon. They tell us thousands and thousands of men will be out of work unless we have the saloon, quite regardless of fact that through the saloon more men lose their jobs than through any other half dozen agencies."

A STATEMENT. The Committee of One Hundred did not ask for a number of Portland taxpayers who are opposed to the dry movement—that would be silly; we know that there are plenty of them. We might have published the names of the 42,000 persons who signed the Oregon dry petition.

The Committee of One Hundred wanted to know and still wants to know the names of 100 Oregonians willing to sponsor the statements made by the wet organizations. Several of these are repeated in the advertisement: The statement that 10,000 men will be thrown out of work as a result of state-wide prohibition.
