County and of 1921 in Clackamas County, giving him a majority in the two counties of 1829.

The voters dealt unkindly with the referred and initiated measures on the ballot and returned favorable majorities for only seven of the 27 propositions.

Measures Dealt With. Besides prohibition the measures that have carried in the county are city and county consolidation, provision for merger of cities, the two normal school bills, abolishing punishment and requiring citizenship as a voting qualification.

The dentistry bill, which first seemed to have carried in the county, was lost by more than 1500.

The non-partisan judiciary is behind in the county by the narrow margin of 24 votes.

"Primary" Bill Walloped. Multnomah County showed no patience at all for the so-called "primary" delegate bill, which was a movement to legalize the assembly and walloped it to the tune of 49,355 to 7361—a net majority against it of 41,644.
