

MASS OF VOTES TO BE BEGUN TODAY

Secretary of State Olcott Announces Results of November Election.

259,868 CAST BALLOTS

Scrutiny Shows Many Disregarded Party Affiliation as Registered. Next Step is Issuance of Certificates to Winners.

HALEM, Or., Dec. 1.—(Special.)—Secretary of State Olcott today announced the official results of the November election, and tomorrow he, in the presence of Governor West, formally will canvass the vote in all counties that for Governor, which will be canvassed by the Legislative Assembly. Governor West will issue certificates of election to all successful candidates but the one for Governor immediately after Mr. Olcott finishes the canvass.

The total vote cast was 259,868 out of a registration of 304,730. More than 10,000 of the electors did not vote in the three districts. The total number of voters cast for Governor was 248,052; for aspirants for United States Senator, 245,880, and for the aspirants for Representative in Congress in the three districts, 236,472.

Registration and Voting Differ. That a great many electors registered as being affiliated with one party and voted for the nominees of another is shown by the totals in the races for Governor and United States Senator. There were 174,933 persons registered as Republicans and 124,895 as Democrats. Withycombe, who received the highest vote of any candidate, received 121,037 votes and Dr. C. J. Smith, Democratic nominee, received 88,829. The Democratic registration was 78,921.

Vote on Measures Heavy. The universal eight-hour law drew the largest vote of the measures submitted to the people. Of the 217,343 votes cast, 167,833 were against the amendment. For the prohibition amendment the vote was 136,342 favorable and 109,352 unfavorable; for abolishing the death penalty the vote was 109,552 favorable and 109,395 against, and for the amendment providing that voters must be citizens of the country, the only other measure approved, the vote was for 164,879, and against 38,447.
