WAR LAID TO ANARCHY
SCOPE IS INTERNATIONAL, SAYS GERMAN EDUCATOR.
Only 50 of Last 3000 Years Not Torn by War, but 8000 Peace Treaties Were Made, Says Speaker.
CHICAGO, Dec. 15.—International anarchy is the factor of the present civilization causing the war, according to Dr. John Mez, of the University of Munich, president of the International Society of Students, in an address here today.
"The main factor in international relations," he said, "is the desire for trade, gain, colonies and conquest. War is the necessary outcome of the present condition of society, which is international anarchy."
"In the last 3000 years there have only been 50 years without war, and there have been 8000 peace treaties."
Among the steps necessary to make peace something more than armed neutrality, Professor Mez said, was a concert of the powers to police the world

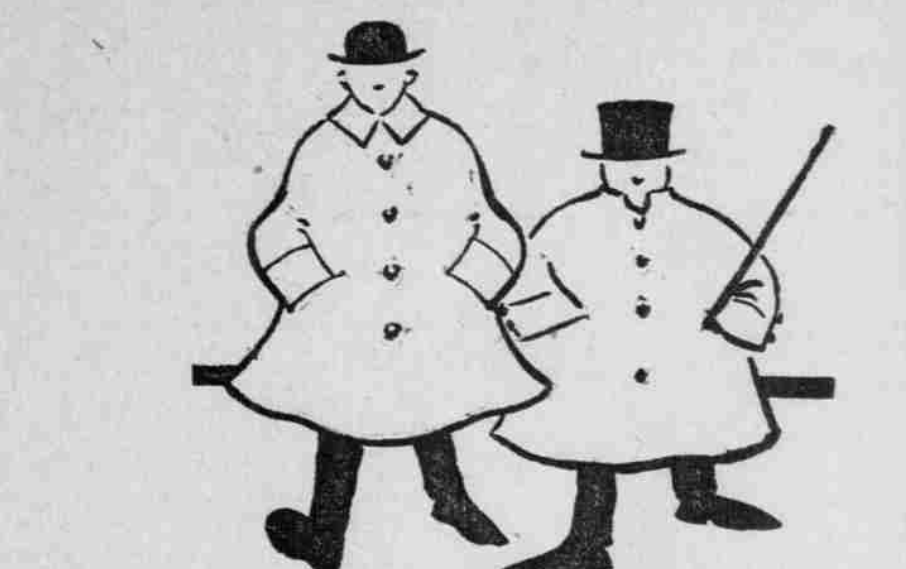

SLAYER LANDED IN JAIL

MARTIN SAYS HE KILLED HUBBARD IN SELF DEFENSE.
No Resistance Offered When Officers Arrive at Martin's Home in Southern Oregon.
MEDFORD, Or., Dec. 18.—(Special.)—After spending the entire night guarding the body of A. S. Hubbard on a lonely trail near Elk Creek, Sheriff Singler and Deputy Sheriff Wilson at sunrise this morning walked to the cabin of Loris Martin, arrested him and brought him to the jail at Jacksonville, where he is held tonight without bail. Much to the surprise of his friends, Martin made no attempt to get away and did not resist arrest. He met Sheriff Singler on the trail in front of his cabin, and with the remark, "Guess I am the man you are looking for," handed over his rifle, kissed his mother good-by and was brought at once to Medford, where he consulted Attorney Reames and asked him to take his defense.
According to Martin's story he shot Hubbard in self-defense. "I met Hub-

bard and Deputy Warden Irwin as I was returning to my cabin after baiting my traps," he told Police Chief Hittson. "After greeting them Hubbard jumped off his horse and, pulling his gun, walked toward me. I had a gun in one hand and an ax in the other. Don't come any nearer, I said, or I'll shoot. Hubbard didn't stop, but came faster. I fired from my hip with one hand and he dropped. I shot him in self-defense."
Martin is about 40 years old and is unmarried. He was born in Southern Oregon and is a picturesque type of the pioneer trapper and woodsman. Lean, slight, but hard as nails, he has eked out a precarious existence for 25 years with his rifle and traps. He had the reputation of being the best shot in Jackson County. Coroner Kellogg returned with Hubbard's body tonight and an inquest will be held tomorrow.

LAND FRAUD IS ASSERTED
Society of Doukhobors Want Refund for Purchase in Linn County.
—ALBANY, Or., Dec. 18.—(Special.)—Asserting that the man who acted as their agent and interpreter when they purchased 1000 acres of land in Linn County deceived them, the Society of Independent Doukhobors today brought suit in the State Circuit Court here to set aside the contract and get a refund of \$7000 already paid, on a purchase price of \$60,000 and a refund of \$4000 for improvements made on the

property. B. J. Hecker and Ada Hecker, who owned the land sold, are named as defendants.
About a year ago the plaintiff society, which is composed of Russians from Western Canada, purchased 1000 acres of land near Peoria, in this county, for the purpose of colonizing it and farming it. A large number of Russians moved on the land and have been farming it since that time.

TAX FALLS ON ALIMONY
Person Who Pays Must Withhold Government Share at Source.
—WASHINGTON, Dec. 18.—Alimony is fixed income and the person who pays it must withhold any amounts due under the income tax. This decision was announced today by Commissioner of Internal Revenue Osborn, in a synop-

sis of rulings on the law, which were in disagreement with previous rulings.
The synopsis makes it clear that while an American woman who marries a foreigner takes his nationality, she cannot claim exemption on property liable to the tax.
Salaries of United States Judges appointed since the law was enacted are subject to the tax, as are those of retired judges. The mileage of Congressmen is subject to tax, except that part actually expended in transportation.
Fees received by preachers are regarded as part of taxable income. Christmas gifts are not taxable.

ALBANY WAR VETERANS TO PRACTICE.
ALBANY, Or., Dec. 18.—(Special.)—A rifle club, which will be affiliated with the National Rifle Association of America, has been formed by Spanish War Veterans here. Frank C. Stellmacher was chosen president of the new organization; Charles H. Baker, vice-president; Alvin C. Baker, secretary; R. C. Churchill, treasurer, and E. S. Hawker, executive officer. The club has been named The Spanish War Veterans' Rifle Club of Albany.

Certificate of Nomination Filed.
SALEM, Or., Dec. 18.—(Special.)—J. R. Callahan, of Tillamook, today filed with Secretary of State Glcott a certificate of nomination by electors for District Attorney in Tillamook County. A recall election has been called for De-

ember 29, charges of incompetency having been preferred against M. J. Gersoni, the incumbent. Other applicants for the office are J. Victor A. Farnell and T. H. Goyne.
