ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR RAZING NOW IN EFFECT.

Active Campaign for Destruction of Dangerous Buildings to Begin—Appeal to Council Provided.

Under the provisions of a new city ordinance which went into effect yesterday, providing a new method for the condemnation by the city of dilapidated or dangerous buildings, proceedings are to be started at once for the razing of a number of structures on the West Side.

City Commissioner Dieck yesterday prepared the list of structures upon which the new ordinance will be tried out first. It includes: The Frazier & McLean barn at Fifth and Taylor streets, building owned by R. L. Ray, at 265 Front street, building owned by Solomon Bloom at 276-2 Taylor street; building owned by the Donovan estate at 245 Taylor street and several small buildings owned by the Ray estate on Yamhill street, between Third and Fourth streets.
