BUDGET IS BACKED

Lease of Harriman Bridge Upper Deck Recommended.

MUCKRAKER HISSED DOWN

Unanimous approval of the tentative county budget drawn by the citizens' advisory committee and amended by the County Commissioners was voiced at the public taxpayers' meeting in the Courthouse yesterday morning. Recommendation also was made by unanimous vote that the Harriman bridge be leased on the best terms obtainable. The budget calls for a total of \$1,048,840.85 of which \$529,250.05 must be raised by taxation.
