Besides it is stated there is nothing in the law to interfere with one having liquor for his guests at his own table. Indeed the provision against "giving away" liquor is in-tended only, it is said, to guard against using the gift as a device to evade the law exclution sales. One way also law prohibiting sales. One may also make cider or wines for private use. The proposed law will hold the owner of property responsible for the use of mises as a place where illegal sales of liquor are attempted.


