# KARLSRUHE SUNK, MONTREAL HEARS

Letter From British West Indies Tells of Wreckage That Has Drifted Ashore.

### FIGHTING SEEN, NOT HEARD

Writer Says Fishermen Found Dead Bodies and That Life Buoy With Name of German Vessel Confirms His Belief.

MONTREAL Quebec, Jan. 12.—A de-tailed description of a naval battle off Grenads, British West Indies, is given in a letter received here today from an eye-wilness, who asserts that in his epinion the German cruiser Karlsruhe

The letter was dated Grensds, December 3, and the writer asserts that after the battle a life buoy came ashore marked "H. M. S. Karlsruhe," together with wreckage and barrels and foodstiffs. The Karlsruhe last was definitely heard from October 26, when she captured the Lamport & Hoit liner Vandyck. The Vandyck was the 17th vessel that had been caught by the German cruiser. No vessels, so far as is known, have been captured by the Karlsruhe since October 26.

The British Admiralty has made no announcement concerning the reported sinking of the Karlsruhe. Heretofore the Admiralty has been prompt to announce any disaster to German war-

Farn sailed from Barry, Wales, last September with a cargo of coal for Montevideo. She was captured in the Atlantic by the Karlsruhe in October and her crew transferred to the steamer Crefeld, which took them to the Canary Islands.
