Furnory Terretrat to Cost \$200,000, -The proposed freight terminal to be built by the O.-W. R. & N. Company at The Dalles, to cost \$200,000, is de-arribed in the tatest issue of the Rali-way Age-Gazette. The terminal will include six switching-yard tracks, each 4000 feet long, a 12-stall roundhouse, a machine shop, 40 by 40 feet; a store-house, 40 by 30 feet; a water tank, coaling plant, cinder conveyor and turntable. There will be also approx-imately two miles of new track. The excavation will amount to about 108,400 cubic yards and 236 tons of steel will be required. 


