Quarter ended December 31, 1914, showed that St. Johns had a \$573,240 cash balance at the start of the year. LIVESTOCK BOARD AHEAD
Of \$50,000 Appropriation for Biennium Nearly Half Is Left.

STATE CAPITOL, Salem, Or., Jan. 21.—(Special.)—Sixty veterinarians, who are secretary of the Livestock Sanitary Board, announced today that the department had expended \$25,128.99 of the appropriation for two years of \$50,000. The expenditure was for 18 months. Cattle tuberculosis inspection numbered 15,221; mallein inspection, 211, and sheep inspected, 400,000. Of the cattle inspected for tuberculosis, 12,297 were passed. Owners of cattle destroyed because of infection were reimbursed to the extent of \$457,765.
