After having been buffeted back and forth in the sessions of the City Councit for 15 months, Commissioner Brewpassed yesterday by a vote of four to one. Commissioner Bigelow voted against it on the ground that it has some unsatisfactory provisions. It was admitted that it is not in as good shape as it might be, but it was decided that changes could be made later, rather than hold up the ordinance any longer. It will go into effect March 19.

This ordinance makes a number of important changes in traffic regulations. Among the most important are the speed limits, the subjection of pedestrian traffic to the signals of traffic policemen; reducing the congested district boundaries, reducing the district in which parking of automobiles is not permitted and requiring automobile drivers to signal with their arms before backing, slowing down or turning.

The measure has been altered considerably since it was introduced. At a series of public hearings and at Council conferences changes have been made. A number of objectionable features were eliminated and a number of new provisions inserted. The measure embraces the principal features of the old traffic ordinance prepared by the old traffic ordinance prepared by the Portland Automobile Association

Parking Restriction Reduced.

The district in which parking of automobiles during the daytime is prohibited has been increased to take in the following district: Reginning at First and Oak street, thence south along First to the south line of Yambill, west to Fifth, north to south line of Morrison, west to Teath, north to Stark, east to Park, north to Oak and east to First affect. Within this district no automobile may stand longer than half an hour within any two-hour period between 9 A. M. and 6 F. M. except on Sundays and holidays.

Warnings Are Required. Drivers are required in the new or-dinance to give "timely and unmistakdinance to give "timely and unmistak-able signal by outstretched arm before slowing down, stopping or turning." Regarding headlights, the measure re-quires lights to be so controlled that they "will not blind, dazzle or confuse other users of the streets or make it difficult or unsafe for them to ride, drive or walk thereon." Use of sound signals, except in giving a necessary warning, is probibited.

Speed limits are changed as follows:
Outside the congested district automobiles are limited to 20 miles an hour.
The rate is 25 miles under the old ordinance. Emergency vehicles are limited to 25 miles an hour in all parts of the city. For freight trucks of 4000 pounds capacity or over the speed is 12 miles an hour. The limit for passenger cars in the congested district is 15 miles.

We further record our opinion that it is not an opportune time for the City Commission to endeavor to fix a minimum standard of wages or working hours in view of the general industrial depression, the large number of unemployed and the need of giving employers the widest latitude in engaging inbor on terms such as conditions make practicable.

CLOTHING NOW BEING MADE WILL BE GIVEN TO LOCAL POOR.

Assistance Asked to Keep Sewing-Room in Existence Upon Which Many Families Are Depending.

Through the efforts of the citizens' employment committee 60 women have been given work in the last 16 days been given work in the last is and the 392 persons dependent upon these women have been assured of food and shelter for 30 days. The committee conducts a sewing-room on the fourth floor of the Journal building, where there are 25 machines, at which the workers are making garments. The sewing-room was established with \$1000 from the Belgian relief fund and all of the articles made at first were sent to the Belgians, but now that the original sum has been exhausted, the garments made in the future probably will be used for local charlitable work.

As a result of the early efforts of this committee, the local problem of unemployment among women has been solved in some degree; 379 dozen garments have been made and 4548 persons will receive clothing. The most worthy cases were selected from the Catholic Women's League, the Associated Charlities, the People's Institute, the Neighborhood House and the Winter relief bureau. MACHINE MAY GUIDE TRAFFIC MACHINE MAY GUIDE TRAFFIC Device With Red and Green Lights for Busy Crossings Proposed.

If the City Council approves a plan worked out by Municipal Traffic Engineer Kirkpatrick and approved by the fire and police bureaus and the Safety First Commission. Portland soon will have automatic traffic regulators to take the place of the present intersection policeman. The proposed plan will be auspinted to the Council by Commissioner Dieck.

Under the system as proposed there will be suspended 15 feet above the pavement in the center of an intersection a signal dial. This will have four sides with a lens on each side. The lenses will be backed by red and green cletric lights. The indicator will be connected with a switchboard arranged on the curb. Green lights will be shown to indicate that the road is clear and red lights on all sides and a loud gong will clang a warning of the approach of the fire sparatus.
