

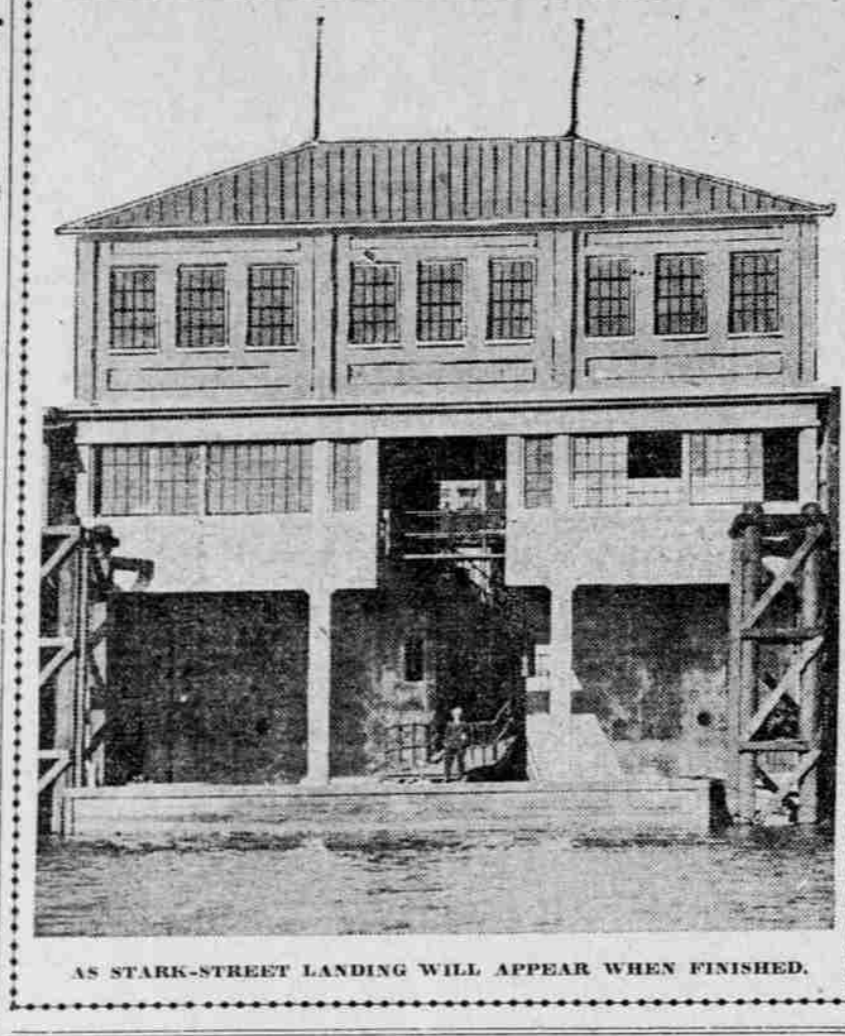

Second Floor to Be Added to Municipal Dock.

COST WILL RUN TO \$7500. Total Annual Maintenance Not in Excess of \$1000, Whereas Commission Now is Paying \$100 Monthly for Quarters.

At a cost of \$7500 a second floor is to be added to the municipal boatlanding at the foot of Stark street, and quarters provided there for the Commission of Public Docks and its entire force. Janitor service, lights, heat, sinking fund provisions and interest will make the total annual maintenance not in excess of \$1000, whereas the Commission now pays \$100 a month for quarters.
