He has completed a deal whereby the celebrated Lambardi Grand Opera Company, Marlo Lambardi, impressario, will appear in the Buker Theater, commencing April 8, with famous singers as solo artists a well-trained and numerically strong chorus, new scenery, new costumes and an orchestra of 17 musicians, led by the noted Luigi Corchetti. The company is engaged for a season of four weeks, which may be extended, Conditions which have made possible the presentation of so ambitious an organization as Lambardi's at popular prices have not heretofore existed.
