"It may be that we will not see in this generation an invasion of the Pacific Coast by a hostile force," said Adjutant-General White, "but if that state arises, it is declared by military experts that the best stroke of strategy that we could perform would be to burn our cities on the Coast, wipe out every vestige of our civilization here and retire behind the barrier of the Cascade Mountains.
