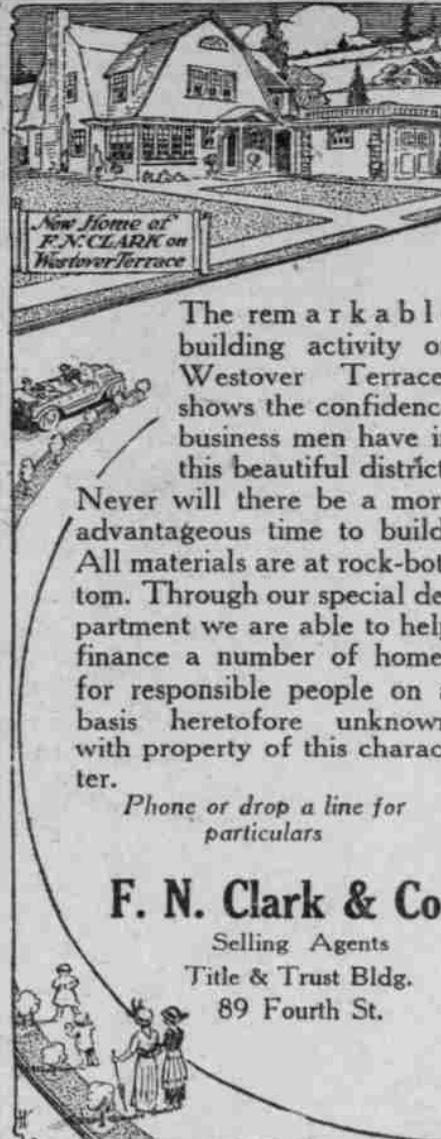

THURSDAY CLUB STUDIES OREGON HISTORY.—"The Currency of Early Oregon" was the subject of the address delivered by George H. Himes, of the Oregon Historical Society, last night in the Gresham Library before the Tuesday Study Club. Mr. Himes showed the old dies from which some of the currency was made and told of the "beaver money" issued among the pioneers. Miss Aurilla Hoagland was in charge. After roll call, which was responded to by the members naming Oregon rivers, the following papers were read: "The Gold Excitement," by James Sterling; "The Origin Question," by George H. Himes; "Oregon's Location to the Organization of the Provisional Government," which was started at Champeoz May 3, 1843, by George F. Hovey; and "The Oregon Question," which should visit the museum of the Oregon Historical Society during the week.
