

GERMAN SAYS TASK STILL IS DIFFICULT

Military Expert Warns People Against Indulging Extravagant Hopes.

FOE'S RESOURCES NOTED

Russian Ability to Make Use of Numerical Superiority Conceded. Allies on West Regarded 'Firm as Cement.'

BERLIN, via Amsterdam to London, May 7.—Major Morant, the military correspondent of the Tägblatt, who is sharing the general opinion of the recently reported German successes, urges the necessity of curbing extravagant hopes, "for," he says, "the Russians at the right moment always understand how to make use of numerical superiority."

Major Morant declares that the Russians, with their capacity in men, will set a boundary as soon as possible to the advance of the Teutons, but that the "Teutons can cherish the justification of their position, because they understand how to make use of numerical superiority."

WAR FUND IS INCREASED

FRENCH CHAMBER VOTES DESIRED GRANT BY ACCLAMATION. Deficit at End of April Given as \$300,000,000—Agreement of British to Place Loan Told.

PARIS, May 7.—Alexandre Ribot, Minister of Finance, addressing the Chamber of Deputies today on the financial situation, concluded his speech with the statement that the deficit at the end of April was 1,500,000,000 francs (\$300,000,000), while the public up to the end of April had taken 1,300,000,000 francs (\$260,000,000) in national defense bonds.

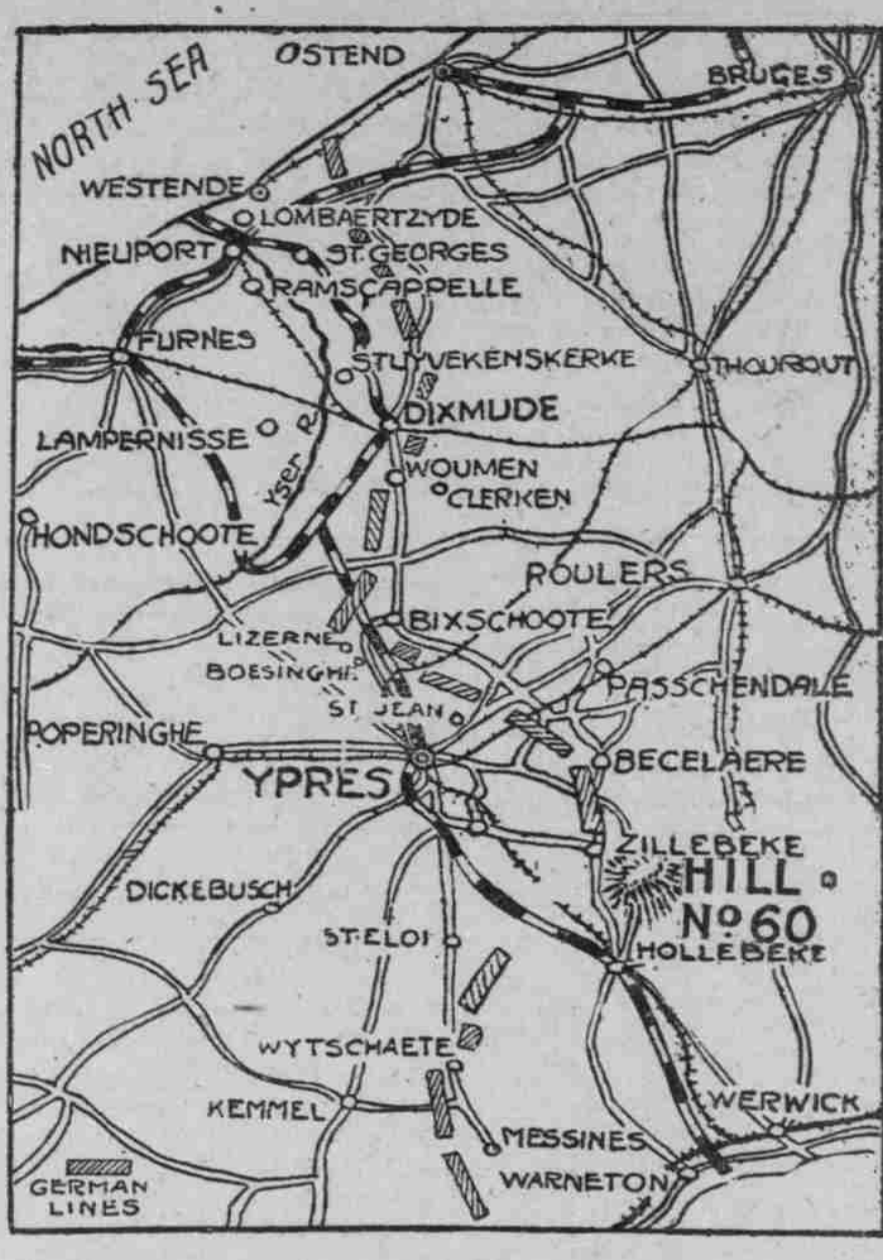
CHILD OUTRANKS CLASSICS

ARMENIANS ARE WATCHED
