Boys' and Girls' Relief Body Hears Annual Reports.

4537 CHILDREN CARED FOR

Society Responsible for 543 and 491 Became Its Charges During Year, Says Head—Three Trustees Are Elected.

That the Boys' and Girls' Aid Society of Oregon has cared for 4537 children during the 20 years of its existence was affirmed by Superintendent Runo Arne in his report read at the annual meeting of the society held at room A. Central Library, last night.

There were 65 children in the Receiving Home on May 1, 1914, according to the report of Mr. Arne.

Of these children 37 have been placed in homes and 247 have gone into homes where they are accepted as members of the family.

At the present time the society is responsible for 543 children of whom 478 have been placed in free homes throughout the state and 65 of whom are in the Receiving Home.
