ASTORIA, Ore., June 14.—(Special.)—The gasoline schooner Patsy sailed today for Yaguina with general cargo.

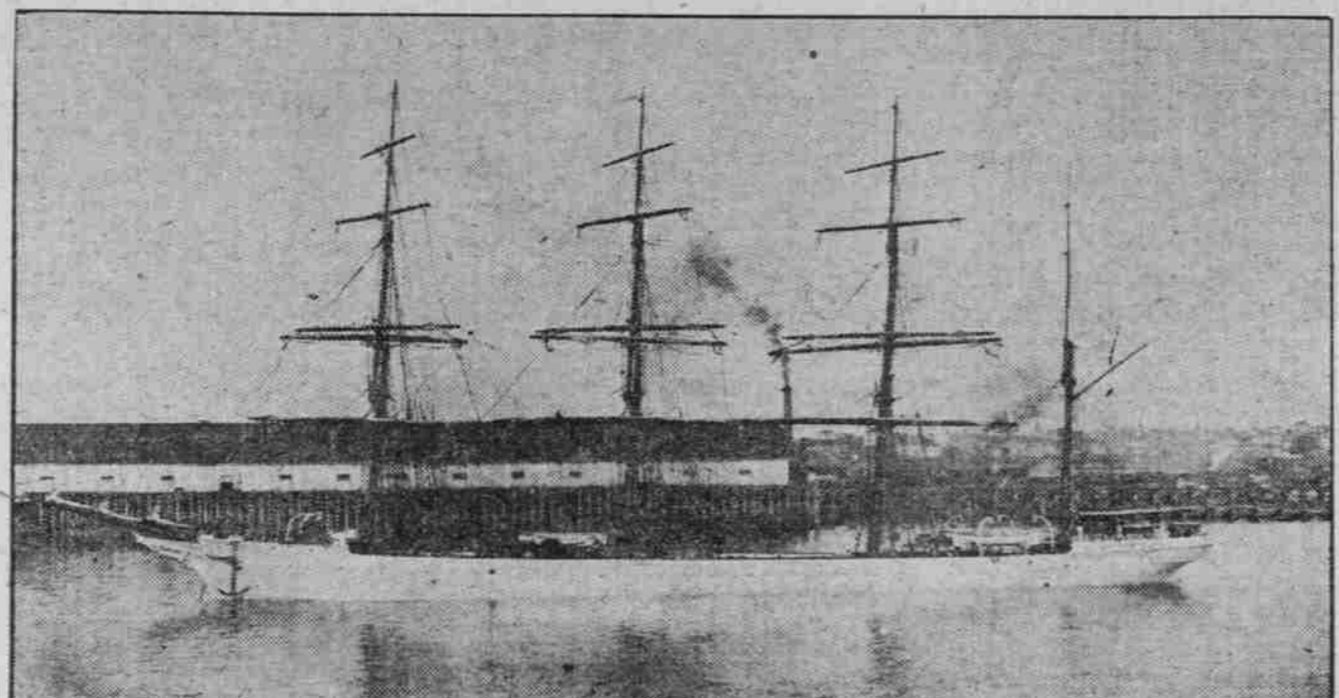
FLORENCE, Ore., June 14.—(Special.)—The gasoline schooner Tillamook arrived at noon from Bandon.
