## SALOONMAN IS INDICTED

GRAND JURY FINDS TRUE BILL IN NATURALIZATION PERJURY CASE.

Twelve Indictments Brought In by May

## Jurors Are Dismissed—Robbery Suspect Exonerated.

Twelve indictments, one of them secret, and two not true, bill were returned by the Mac United States grand jury in its final report to Federal Judge Bean at 4:30 o'clock yesterday. Judge Bean then discharged the jurors.

The most important of the indictments was that against Dominico Grano, owner of a saloon at First and Clay streets, on a charge of testifying falsely in the hearing of Frank Vaccarini on his final petition for naturalization papers in Judge Davis' court some months ago.

A not true bill was found on the charge of violating the Mann white slave act against J. M. Wise, former member of the Portland police "moral squad," who deserted his wife and ran away with Alma Gooding last February. They were later located in Seattle, and Wise returned voluntarily to Portland. The Gooding woman was the principal witness against Wise before the grand jury, though she appeared only because she was subpoenaed.

A not true bill also was found on the charge of robbing the postoffice at Junction City, Or., November 17, 1914, against Thomas Watson, alias Charles Gruber and Thomas Jepson. The grand jury found there was no sufficient evidence against Watson, who has been held in jail several months.

Other indictments were:

H. D. Burns, Belmont Goodman, George Durkee and H. H. McCann, selling liquor to Indians ball fixed at \$500 each; Clyde Cooper, Ethel Whitecraft and Thornton Robinson, having habit-forming drugs in their possession; the ball of the Mansfield act, ball fixed at \$1000 each; S. B. Smith, having opium in his possession in violation, smuggled over from Canada, ball \$1000; Chester Harvey and Mrs. Walter Coffee, having drugs in their possession, ball \$500 each; and one secret indictment.

ASTORIA, Or., July 2.—(Special)—June was an unusually dry month in Astoria. According to the records in Weather Observer Gilmore's office, the total precipitation during the month was 2.1 inches, 1.8 inches less than the average for the corresponding month of previous years. Rain fell on 12 days, while there were 18 clear, eight partly cloudy and four cloudy days. The highest temperature was 88 degrees, while the lowest was 46 degrees above zero.
