Pastor at Kelso Resigns.

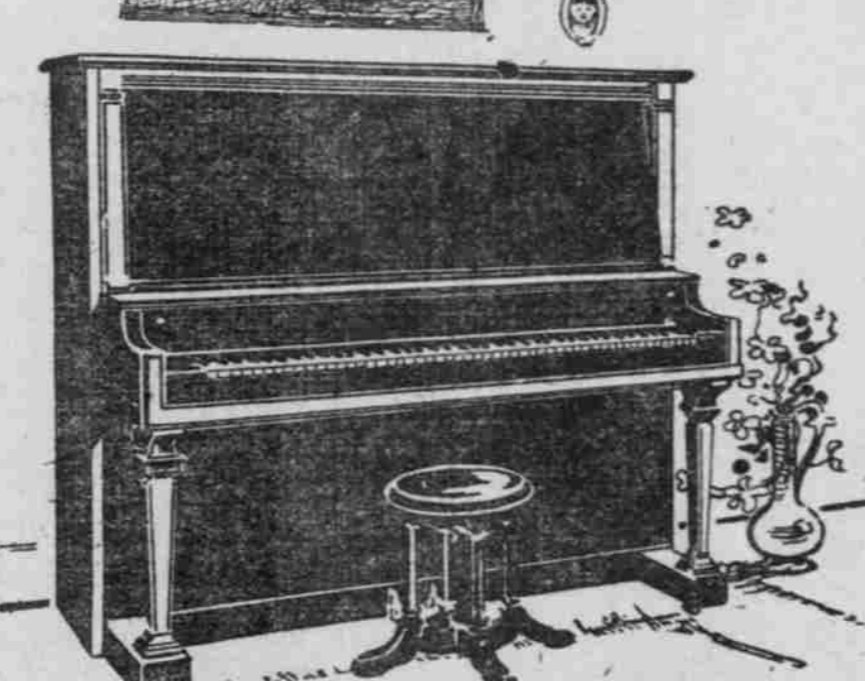
Rev. Claude B. Latimer, pastor of the Kelso Presbyterian Church for the past four and one-half years, has announced his resignation, to take effect September 1.
