It failed here for the second time this week in the attempt to consolidate the Preachers' Slough and Melbourne districts, where, although three Directors signed a call for the election, only one vote was cast in favor of consolidation. Some weeks ago an election for the consolidation of the Oakville and Rosemond districts resulted in a tie vote. The State Superintendent has set August 7 as the date of the election, which will decide this tie.
