A new rate for the shipment of grain from the Pacific Coast to South Africa was set yesterday in the announcement that M. H. Houser had fixed the French ship Ernest Reyer to load wheat for South African ports at 80 shillings. This is the first vessel announced thus far to have been booked for this sealoading for South Africa. Vensels for last season's loading received

a rate of from 27s 6d to 40s. The rate on the Ernest Reyer is as The rate on the Ernest Reyer is as high as that fixed for transporting grain to Europe in spite of the danger from submarines in those waters. The rates thus far for the European trip ranges from 30 shillings to 37s 6d. Grain steamers for this season's loading for Europe are receiving around 25 shillings. Among those recently chartered at that rate is the British steamer Reading, which has been booked by Strauss & Co. and will carry grain to Europe.

One reason for the high rate given the Ernest Reyer is that the vessel will be available for early loading. She arrived at San Francisco from Newcastle, New South Wales, July 26, and should be able to start for Portland in a chart time.


