M. H. Houser Charters Vessel for Grain to War Zone.

45 ARE BOOKED FOR FALL

Tokai Maru to Be First of Larg Flect to Take on Cargoes Here for Great Britain and Other European Points.

Under charter to M. H. Houser to load grain here, the Japanese steamer Tokal Maru left San Francisco Satur-day night for Portland. She should arrive here Tuesday night or Wednesmorning

day morning. The charter of the Tokai Maru was announced last Wednesday. The vessel was taken with options for United Kingdom ports, Mediterranean ports, Australia, South Africa and the west coast of Australia. The Tokai Maru is a vessel of 2289 tons register and can handle about 5000 tons dead weight. She will be the first of a large number of vessels now en route to this port to take on grain cargo. Forty-five grain vessels, including

Forty-five grain vessels, including both stramers and salling craft, have been booked for Fall loading. They represent a total tonnage of 98,404. Twelve ships are now on the way to this port for grain loading, and some of them should arrive now in a short time. A few, however, are out from European ports, and it is difficult to estimate the time for their arrival.
