

WHEELER TO KEEP DISTRICT ATTORNEY

Proposal to Recall J. K. Starr Is Defeated by Voters at Polls.

MAJORITY WILL BE HEAVY

Ten Out of Thirteen Precincts Give 551 Votes Against Recall and Only 116 in Its Favor.

PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 16.—(Special).—The proposed recall of J. K. Starr, District Attorney for Wheeler County, was defeated by a heavy majority at a special election held today.

Returns from 10 of the 13 precincts of the county gave 116 votes in favor of the recall and 551 against it.

The three missing precincts are in remote districts, and the vote therefrom will be light. It was considered certain tonight that the result as forecast would not be altered.

The lightness of the vote was considered to be due largely to the fact that harvest is now in full blast and many farmers did not feel sufficient interest in the issue to leave their fields and vote.

Not all of those who voted in favor of the recall of Mr. Starr voted for Thomas R. Kelly as his intended successor. It was evident that Mr. Kelly's announcement of withdrawal last Saturday was considered seriously by some of those who sought Mr. Starr's recall, even though Mr. Kelly's name was left on the ballot.

The result is considered to have been brought about largely by the active campaign made in Mr. Starr's behalf since the recall petition was filed. His friends rallied and went to the polls to record their protest against what they considered the injustice of the movement against him. They now consider that Mr. Starr has been completely vindicated.
