New York Man Favors Franchise for Women and Says Spirit of Militarism Must Not Be Developed.

Marcus M. Marks, husiness man. That is the title that rightfully belongs to the man who serves as official head of 2,600,000 persons on Manhattan Island and helds a position of Commis-sioner of Public Works in the City of New York. Mr. Marks was in Portland all day yesterday, accompanied by his wife and five children.

Mr. Marks Installed Markets,

Mr. Marks is known as the Presi-dent of the Borough of Manhattan. He belleves in "running a horough on hus iness lines." Mr. Marks hus made sev eral decided changes in the povernment of Manhaitan Boreagh, and of all the edditions and changes the installation of the public markets he thinks his


ef the public markets he thinks his best achievement. "I had no legal right to establish the markets, but after I had them in good running order I had them made legal," saig Mr. Marks. "Opposition was of-fered from every quarter, but I initiat-ed my acheme in the same manner as though I had been the president of a hig corporation. Mr. Marks picks this ad-ministrative force as he would select a corps of employee, allowing no politi-eal strings to be fastened.


