

RELIGIOUS SPIRIT NEEDED, SAYS TAFT

Unnamed Evangelist, However, Rapped for "Shocking Irreverence" of Method.

MEANS HELD UNJUSTIFIED

Good Declared Nullified by Coarseness of Speech and Vulgarities of Illustration—Contrast With Moody Is Drawn.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 25.—Religion was proclaimed as essential in man's life and in his relations to the state, in an address delivered here today before the National Unitarian Conference, by William Howard Taft, who is president of the conference. Unitarianism, Mr. Taft said, was of service in offering a creed compatible with free scientific inquiry. He asserted that as the firm line of missionary activity, advocates of sterner creeds become broadened and liberalized.

Toward the end of his address he spoke at some length of a widely known evangelist, whom he did not name, criticizing his methods and results as an ebullient manifestation of religious excitement. He deprecated any movement to oppose this man's attacks on the Unitarian Church, because there was no common ground for argument and "in mere epithetical assault we have restraints that would put us at great disadvantage."

Religious Spirit Essential.

Mr. Taft spoke at the opening of the business sessions of the 25th Biennial General Conference of the Unitarian and other Liberal Christian churches. "The necessity for the infusion of the religious spirit into prevailing morality for the purpose of giving it life and persistent influence is a fact that every one who studies the life of a people from the standpoint of a responsible administrator of government must recognize," he said. "The study of man's relations to his Creator and his responsibility for his life to God, energizes his moral inclinations, strengthens his self-discipline and restrains his selfishness of paternal obligation to his fellow men and makes him the good citizen without whom popular government would be a failure."

Religious Tolerance Spread.

Mr. Taft traced the spread of religious tolerance from the middle ages, when, he said, there was none, to the present time, when he found "more liberal Unitarianism," he said, "deny that they lose the essence of Christianity when they give up miracles, 'miracles' he explained, was a special divinity of Jesus. They have always emphasized the life of Jesus in his teachings of love as the foundation of all faith, the whole administration is now so catholic and liberal and world-wide in its usefulness."

Evangelist's Work Neutralized.

Mr. Taft expressed belief that the good done by the evangelist whom he discussed was neutralized by the detrimental attacks he delivers against ministers of all faiths. "The evangelist," he said, "has been found 'can a coarseness of speech, a vulgarity of illustration, a shocking irreverence, be justified as a necessary means of reaching the heart and fastening the attention of an audience of persons, however untutored or unrefined.'"

The late Dwight L. Moody, he said, made effective appeal to the plain people in the language of the Psalmist and the prophets."

2 NIGHTRIDERS CONFESS

FLOGGERS OF WOMAN SENTENCED FOR THREE YEARS.

Nine Others on Trial at Hartford, Ky., and 53 More Await Trial on Similar Charges.

HARTFORD, Ky., Aug. 25.—The long struggle of the authorities with lawlessness in this portion of Western Kentucky culminated in the Ohio County Circuit Court here today when more than three score persons were placed on trial for alleged participation in night-riding outrages. When court adjourned two men had pleaded guilty, nine others were on trial and 53 were awaiting a hearing.

The two men who threw themselves on the mercy of the court were sentenced to three years each in the penitentiary for flogging a man and a woman. The nine men were indicted with them. Charges against the remainder allege maltreatment of various persons and the murder of a negro.

Scores of persons in Ohio and contiguous counties have been flogged at night and their homes riddled with bullets without a word of warning by bands of mounted men. Whites and negroes alike have suffered.

The authorities say reasons advanced by the victims indicate the night riders were endeavoring to regulate the conduct of communities through intimidation, displace negro labor with white and fix prices on merchandise. The guilty plea of the first two cases called—those of Jerry Clark and Ernest Webster—caused surprise. It was believed still the defendants would resist conviction.

ABE RUEF NOT 'EXILED'

PAROLED EX-GRAPTEE SELECTS PLACE OF RESIDENCE.

Governor Johnson Says California Prison Board Showed No Consideration Not Given to Others.

SACRAMENTO, Aug. 25.—Governor Johnson today, in commenting on the paroling of Abraham Ruef from the San Quentin state prison, made it plain that the ex-graptee of San Francisco was not "exiled" to Mendocino County by the board of prison directors, but at his own request designated that county as his place of residence. The Governor said:

"For two years past it has been repeatedly said that Ruef will be treated exactly like every other man in state

prison—neither more leniently nor more harshly.

"The prison directors notwithstanding the agitation in his behalf, released him, as they required all others, except in extraordinary cases, to serve half his net sentence. He served half his net sentence and then was paroled."

"San Francisco newspapers have endeavored to make it appear that he has been exiled to Mendocino County. The prison directors merely complied with Ruef's request that his residence be Mendocino County."

"The only comment I would make on the parole is that despite pressure beyond description, the majority of the prison directors have demonstrated that they will treat all who may be confined by the state with absolute

RUSSIANS STILL LOSING

ADVANCE POSITION OF BREIT-LITOVSK PENETRATED.

German Report Continued Advances on All Lines Except Near Riga, in Northern District.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—Continued gains by the Russians in Russia, except near Riga, are reported today by the Berlin war office, while the Austrian official communication says the advances of the Russian army have been penetrated. "The Russian army has been penetrated," it stated, "and the Russian army is now on the opposite side of the Brest-Litovsk marshes from Kovel."

"Russian war theater: The troops of Archduke Ferdinand and General Kozlov, together with our allies, pushed back the enemy, fighting constantly towards Lemberg."

The resistance of the Russians fighting southwest of Brest-Litovsk was broken and they were driven back to the fortress girdle by the division of Field Marshal von Arz and German troops.

"Northeast of Vinograd German forces are driving the enemy farther into the marshy district. The cavalry under General Puhallé is advancing on both sides of the road from Kovel to Brest-Litovsk and is on the opposite side of the Brest-Litovsk marshes from Kovel."

"Hundred Hussars stormed a fortified village on the railway line from Kovel to Brest-Litovsk."
