

16 LEARN TO READ IN 7 HOURS' STUDY

Clackamas Teachers See Tots Group Sounds and Work Problems at Institute.

SIMPLE SUMS ARE ADDED

Mrs. M. L. Fulkerson Demonstrates Methods With Class That Had Never Been in School Before and Pedagogues Amazed.

OREGON CITY, Or., Aug. 26.—(Special.)—The 16 boys and girls in the demonstration of the Clackamas County Teachers' Training School are able to read today after exactly seven hours of actual study.

Mrs. Fulkerson at the opening of the school gathered 16 children aged 6 and 8 years. Two of the children were found to have had previous instruction and were dismissed from the class.

Games Later Introduced. Wholesaler's primer brought to the class to keep up the interest of the children.

The children spent an hour and a half a day in school, half an hour in number work, half an hour in reading and half an hour in play.

Mrs. Fulkerson said today that she would like to continue with the class. "All the difficult work has been done. The foundation has been laid for the education of these children," she said.
