SCRIMMAGE PLAY IS ON
AGGIES GET DOWN TO REAL WORK AT TRAINING CAMP.

Five Men Are Out of Condition Now.
But Coaches Are Pleased by Arrival of Broich, Big Linebacker.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE TRAINING QUARTERS, Sept. 10.—(Special.)—That the team bearing the orange and black standard this season be made up largely from the ranks of the second string men of last year, that the development of the line and kicking material are the serious problems of the coaches, and that the squad now practicing on the beach is the most willing and aggressive which has represented O. A. C. for some time, are the prominent features brought out by the first half of the pre-season training period at Nye Beach.

Light scrimmage work began Thursday afternoon, the running punting, falling on the ball and blocking of the first days.

The only men injured thus far are: Ed Alworth, promising punter and backfield man, who sprang the first Charlie horse of the season; Laythe, Alworth's brother, who is suffering from the same trouble; and Chub Weller, who has a strained arm. Alworth and Weller are also suffering from severe colds.

Walter Broich, a 160-pound lineman, who was ineligible last year because of the rule, has joined the squad. He is fresh from the grind in the harvest fields and ready for immediate action. While on the second string, he tore huge holes in the Varsity line.

TRACK RECORD BROKEN
FIVE-EIGHTHS MILE RUN MADE BY BAKER HORSE IN 1:03.

Lady Hal Again Paces Fast Mile, Covering Distance in 2:10, Before 3700 Spectators at Fair.

BAKER, Or., Sept. 10.—(Special.)—One track record was broken by a Baker horse today, as the 2-year-old gelding, Lady Hal, won the five-eighths mile race over the fairgrounds, owned by J. W. Miller and driven by William Hogoboom, stepped a mile in 2:10 in the 2:25 pace, one quarter second lower than the record made by Lady Hal in 1912. Lady Hal made the mile in 2:04 1/2, Wednesday here. A mother and daughter took prizes in the cow-girl race, Mrs. Bert Caviness, of Baker, winning the half-mile race, and her daughter, Miss Anna Caviness, also of Baker, taking third. Lady Hal won the 2:25 pace, Jack Pittsmons, owned by B. F. Jagger, of Portland, was second; Hal Bear, owned by Clara J. Bessler, of Portland, was third, and Nellie J. owned by Young, of Sprague, Wash., was fourth.

The 2:30 trot was captured by Flora Dora Z, owned by P. J. McCormick, of Seattle. C. E. Silva, owner of T. W. Sacramento, Cal., was second; A. A. Fidler's Amy McKinney, of Haines, was third, and J. B. Stetson's Novella, of Baker, was fourth.
