ROAD DISTRICTS REDUCED Coos on Verge of Holding Election to Vote \$440,000 Bonds.

MARSHFIELD, Or., Sept. 22.—(Special.)—The County Court of Coos has re-districted the county road areas and the districts have been reduced from 23 to 14. Following the new law, there are eight municipal districts, including those of Marshfield, Empire, North Bend, Eastside, Beaver Hill, Brandon, Coquille and Myrtle Point. This leaves six districts for the county communities and some of them will be of large extent.
