

BEAR IS HEAVILY LADEN

Southbound Carriers Take More Than 2000 Tons of Cereal in One Day—Dock Space Needed for Interior Produce.

BEAR IS HEAVILY LADEN

More than 2000 tons of wheat moved out of Portland for California yesterday, and additional shipments are to be made next week, so at least a month will have been covered of activity in that line.

The steamer Bear, sailing yesterday morning, had aboard 1400 tons of the cereal, and the Geo. W. Elder, dispatched last night, were several hundred tons, her entire cargo being 1400 tons of which wheat, flour, milled oats and barley are the principal items.

Portland Wholesalers Propose to Appeal to Commission. MARSHFIELD, Or., Sept. 29.—(Special.)—Taking the steamship Breakwater from the Coos Bay-Portland run has worked to the great disadvantage of Portland wholesale houses, whose local representatives find themselves confronted with a 33 rate from San Francisco to Coquille, via Bandon, whereas a direct rate from Portland amounts to \$7.50 per ton, including 50 cents cartage in Marshfield from docks to the Southern Pacific depot.

PROHIBITION CASE IS SET

Olympia Hearing Will Consume Whole Day October 22. OLYMPIA, Wash., Sept. 29.—(Special.)—The Supreme Court will devote an entire day, Friday, October 22, to an oral hearing on the M. & K. Gottstein case, involving the validity of the Washington prohibition law, it was announced yesterday. This will be the first time in recent years, if not in the history of the state, that so much time has been devoted to a single case. Arguments occupied three days in the lower court.

WATER SYSTEM WORK DUE

Aberdeen Will Employ Only Own Labor on Project. ABERDEEN, Wash., Sept. 29.—(Special.)—City Engineer L. D. Kelsey expects to begin work the latter part of this week upon the Wishkah River gravity water system, for the building of which Aberdeen residents voted \$400,000 in bonds Saturday. Actual construction probably will begin as soon as the survey is completed. The city administration has pledged itself to use only Aberdeen labor. The pipe also probably will be made by Aberdeen mills.
