

EAST WOULD RESELL

Wheat Buyers Disposed to Unload Recent Purchases.

TURN WOULD MEAN PROFIT

Advance in Northwest Checks Trading for Shipment to Southeastern Mills—Bids at Merchants' Exchange Irregular.

Shipping of wheat for shipment to the Eastern states has come to a halt. The buyers have been unable to find wheat at the prices they are willing to pay.

Local dealers report a somewhat freer selling movement in wheat in the Northwest, although the advance at Chicago yesterday served, in a measure, to check sales.

At the Merchants' Exchange the bidding was irregular, offers for bluestem and fortyfold being reduced 1/2 to 2 cents, while bids for old wheat were raised 1/2 to 2 cents.

The barley and oats markets were quiet, with no change from Saturday's bids. Barley was offered in small quantities.

France—Harvesting is about finished. The crop is good, but the yield is not as high as last year.
