

CHICAGO WAKES UP WITHOUT HEADACHE

Courts Free From Deluge of Drunk Cases Arter First Dry Sunday.

ECONOMIC BENEFIT SHOWN

Employers of Labor on Large Scale Find Monday Efficiency Improved Because of Abstaining From Debauch.

CHICAGO, Oct. 11.—(Special.)—Chicago, with a few exceptions, awoke this morning and went to work with a clear head. It was a new experience and due to the closing of saloons Sunday. There were sporadic exceptions. Two of these were found dead, having consumed so much booze, just to prove that no Mayor or law could step on their rights, that they killed them.

Perhaps the most striking point, however, from a purely economic view was the fact that hundreds of men returned to work today fit and sober. Ordinarily large employers of men count on the return Monday of much of their force sore, aching and ugly, the result of a Saturday night and all-day Sunday debauch. Many of these men would be discharged, and those retained would be practically worthless until Tuesday. Interviews with several employers today brought out these facts:

The big packing plants emphasized the feature that their large forces of workmen returned today sober and intact. The Illinois Steel Company said Sunday passed without demoralization among its employees. Every man was at his post on time this morning.

The South Chicago Police Station reported a remarkably small number of "drunks," which is unusual. Only Six Places Found Open. Out of the 7152 saloons in the city only six were actually found open on Sunday, and Mayor Thompson will undoubtedly revoke the licenses of those disposing of them without any protracted court fight.

ANTHRAX PATIENT BETTER

Serum for Cattle Used on Mr. Stackpole With Good Effect.

NEW YORK, Oct. 11.—The use of a special antitoxin serum received from Washington gave George P. Stackpole, the aged Riverhead lawyer, a fighting chance to recover from anthrax, the dread disease which rarely is contracted by human beings, although it is not uncommon among cattle and sheep.
