

NEAR MARKET PRICES Active Buying in Country at Full Prices.

DEMAND IS NOW BROADER Strength of Foreign Situation Due to Possibility of Dardanelles Attempt Being Given Up—Coarse Grains Also Are Higher.

There were no wheat sales on the local board yesterday, and prices were not much changed from the day before, yet the market had a very firm undertone. A fair amount of activity was reported in the various country markets, where there was enough competition to keep prices strong. Not only were exporters buying in the country, but some time past there was also inquiry for California account and reports of some buying by Eastern houses. The Chicago cash market advanced two cents during the day, and there was a rise of one cent in the Omaha cash market. Higher prices at Chicago were due to the belief that the allies may be compelled to give up the effort to force the Dardanelles. The advances there and at Liverpool, and the strength of the cargo market contributed to the firmness in the Northwest. The only changes in bid prices at the Merchants' Exchange were in November wheat fourfold offers being raised 1 1/2 cents, 30-cent, 1 cent, and 1 1/2 cent. Oats and barley bids were raised 2 1/2 to 30 cents, but no business was put through. Flour prices are being well maintained with the steadiness of wheat. There is a noticeable increase in mill-feed stocks, and quotations on bran and shorts were lowered 1 1/2 to 1 cent. SOUTH AMERICAN WOOLLS ARE HIGH Extreme Prices Are Quoted on New Clip, Australia Also Strong.
