### DR. RANSOM FOUND DEAD IN WYOMING

Mill City Man, Missing Since September 17. Victim of Unexplained Shooting.

CASE PROVES MYSTERY

Demise Reported to Have Occurred in Jackson Hole Country Near Hunting Camp From Which

SALEM, Or., Oct. 21 .- (Special.) -- The body of Dr. Clayton L. Ransom, of Mill who disappeared September 17 while on a hunting expedition in the mountains of the Jackson Hole country in Wyoming, was found yesterday by searching parties near the place where he had been camping with Deli B. Judd, a guide. Ransom had been shot and killed. This was the word received at Aumsville word ye by Tom Ransom, a brother of the dead man, in a telegram from Nick McCoy, of Wilson, Wyo.
