Albany Chosen for Next Meeting in April—Committees Are Appointed.

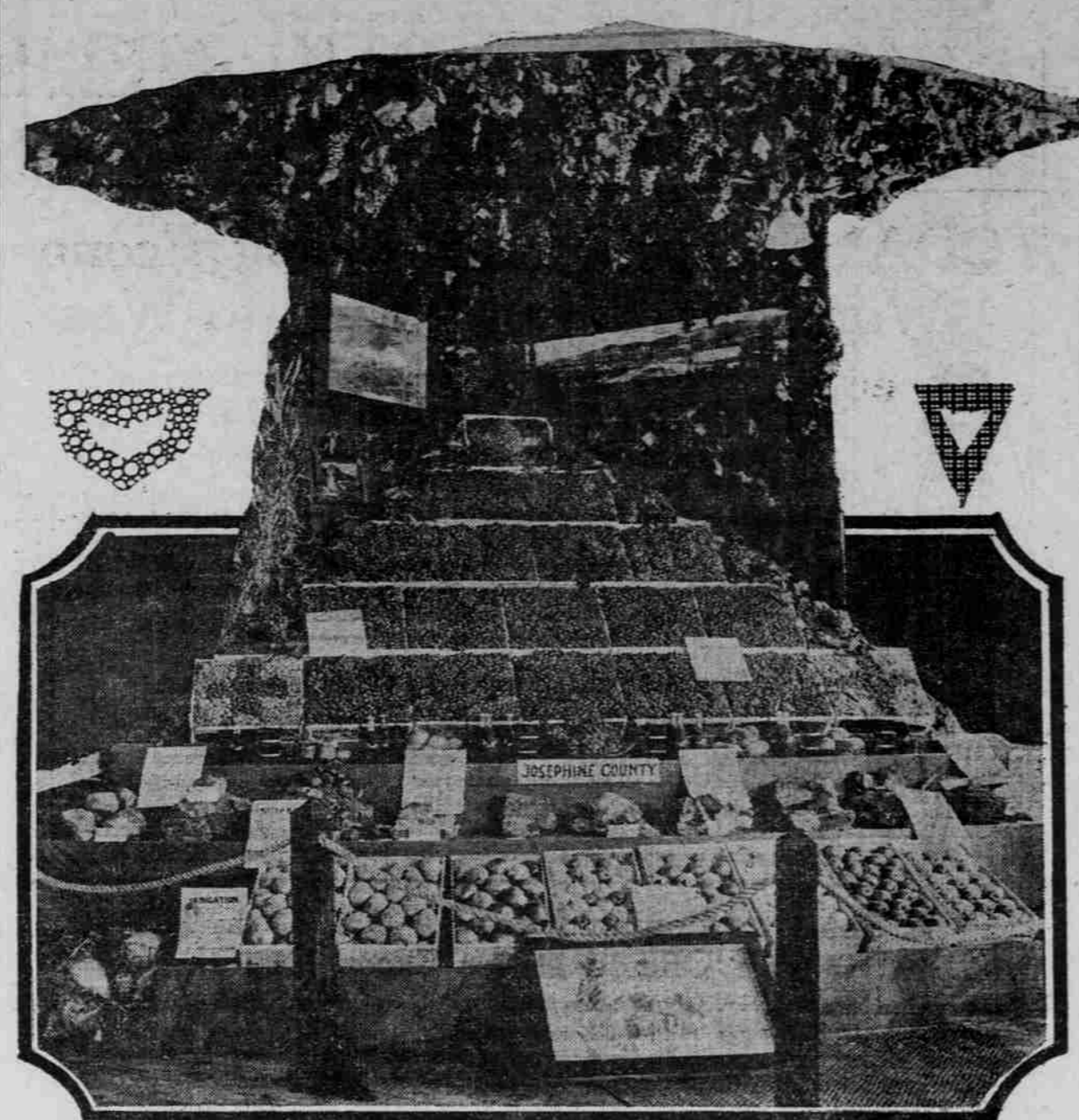

RUSSIA SEEKS CREDIT HERE

Nine Per Cent Interest Is Reported Offer for \$60,000,000.

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—Agents of the Russian government, it was reliably reported here today, are seeking to establish credit in this country somewhat similar to the recent \$50,000,000 Anglo-French credit loan.

Details of the proposed loan were lacking, but in one quarter of this report it was stated that the Russian government was willing to pay as high as 9 per cent interest for a loan of this size.

USURY WARNING ISSUED

COMPTROLLER CALLS BANKS' ATTENTION TO LAW.

Letter Must Be Read at Directors' Meeting and Absent Members Must Be Notified of Rule.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28.—Comptroller of the Currency Williams sent a circular letter to all National banks, calling attention to the oath which each director of a National bank may receive interest on its loans "at the rate allowed by the laws of the state, territory or district where the bank is located, and no more."

"This office," says the letter, "regrets to report that the statement of condition of a great many National banks show this provision of the National act shall be faithfully observed."

"You are respectfully advised and admonished that this provision of the National act shall be faithfully observed."

"You are requested to read this letter at the next meeting of your board of directors. Within 30 days after your next board meeting, and not later than December 20, 1915, you are requested to send to this office letters from all members of your board who may not have been present at the meeting at which this letter is read, acknowledging the receipt by each absent director of a copy thereof."

\$463,928 GIVEN PRINCETON

Quarter Million Presented University by Mrs. Russell Sage.

PRINCETON, N. J., Oct. 28.—Gifts to Princeton University amounting to \$463,928 were announced at a meeting of the trustees today. They include \$250,000 from Mrs. Russell Sage for new dining halls; \$125,000 from Mrs. William Church Osborn, of New York City, for the endowment of the Dodge professorship of medieval history; and \$88,928 to establish the Noel Bassett memorial scholarship.
