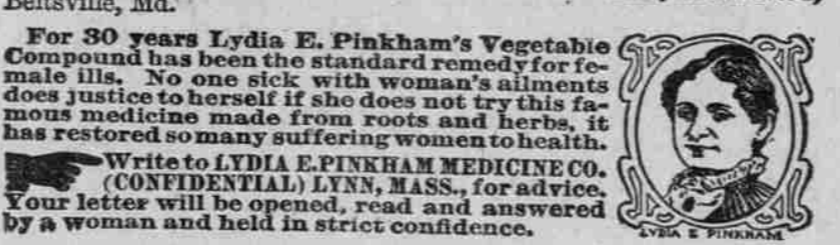

Among the many hard-luck stories which form a part of the daily routine of the offices of City Commissioners was one heard yesterday by Commissioner Baker from Walter Schultz, who complains that he has walked the streets for weeks in an effort to find work enough to supply food to his wife and two children living at 535 Couch street.

Mr. Schultz says he is of German parentage, and consequently, had to leave British Columbia when the Lusitania was sunk. He is a sheet metal worker, and is anxious to get work of any kind. It is said his family has lived for two days on four loaves of bread.
